Dr. Timothy Terrell earned a Ph.D. in economics from Auburn University and has taught at Wofford College in Spartanburg, SC since 2000. His dissertation and some subsequent writing has focused on environmental regulation. Dr. Terrell writes extensively on economics and public policy, and has lectured internationally on economics and ethics. He is the father of three children.

Dr. Hilton Terrell has been practicing medicine and teaching in Florence, S.C. for over 20 years as Associate Professor of Family Medicine in a medical residency program. He holds an M.D. degree from the Medical University of South Carolina and a Ph.D. from USC in Columbia. He is board certified in Family Medicine. For nine years he edited the *Journal of Biblical Ethics in Medicine*. As part of his residency teaching he has directed the residency curriculum in environmental medicine. At present, he is president-elect of the Association of American Physicians and Surgeons. In 2007-08 he tried his hand teaching high school Biology and found it to be one of the most challenging things he has done.
